Debra Costner has purchased **Bay Area BusinessWoman News** from Anna Marks, who founded the free Oakland-based monthly in 1993. Costner was formerly finance and operations director of Yoga Journal. Terms of the purchase were not disclosed. ■ Berkeley-based **Seva Foundation**, a humanitarian organization whose programs include ones to prevent blindness and restore sight to people around the world, has named Mark Lancaster as its executive director.
